Active Re-Entry's 2016 Annual Conference: Focusing on Seniors

Active Re-Entry's annual conference is shifting focus compared to prior years. Instead of focusing primarily on Caregiver's, this one will be focused on Seniors.

The morning session will start off with Rocky Mountain Health & Hospice in which they will provide information about patient rights and HIPPA privacy, as well as helpful devices that are available to aid in independent living. After a short break, there will be a session dedicated to all of the many Veteran benefits that are now available, which most veterans are unaware they may qualify for.

Following another short break, Home and Community Based Services will be presenting about a variety of in-home services that allow adults to remain in their home while receiving support services. Lastly, the State Health Insurance Program (SHIP) and Long Term Care Ombudsman (LTC) will provide information regarding one-on-one counseling and assistance for those who use Medicare, as well as current advocacy issues.

This conference has been approved for 2.75 total CEU's including .75 ethics units and a certificate will be provided at the conference. The Utah Chapter of SSWLHC is providing Continuing Education Units. If anyone is wishing for these CEU's, there is a \$10 fee. Otherwise the conference is free to anyone wishing to attend.

Active Re-Entry's booth was one of the most popular, as was the massage therapists who were giving mini massages and Moab Physical Therapy which was doing a strength contest to see who had the most hand and arm strength.

The Health Fair brings 40 plus vendors from Moab and surrounding areas who deal with Health Issues in our community. 
BEWARE: Scams in Abundance this Season

The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau recently L came out with a statement warning consumers against an asset recovery company scam. These scammers specifically target elderly who have been former victims of any kind of money-making scheme in the past. They promise to help them recover funds previously lost for an upfront fee that could range from hundreds to thousands of dollars. Once the person has paid the fee, he or she does not see anything returned and they have become a victim for a second time.

If you think you have already become a victim of this type of scam, notify your bank or credit card company right away. They can stop any future transactions from occurring. If your information was used without your permission, they should restore the funds back to your account. You can also dispute any charges that were made that did not result in the asset recovery that was promised. You should also report it to local law enforcement and to the Federal Trade Commission at ftcomplaintassistant.gov.

Another type of scam is done via an email that appears to be coming from a government affiliated source. In some cases, scammers send out an email with the subject line "Get Protected" that pretends to offer new features from the Social Security Administration. It says the new features can protect citizens from

activity.



The email recipient only has to click on the email, and the scammers can install what's called malware onto the recipient's computer. This is called phishing, and it will allow viruses and spyware that assist in obtaining personal information to run rampant on the recipient's computer. When clicking on the email, it may also go to a fake page requesting that the user type in his or her personal information.

When you know you have come across a scam, forward the email to spam@uce.gov to report it to the FTC, and also forward the email to the real organization being impersonated. You can also report it to your email provider by marking it as spam and you shouldn't receive anything from them again.
